11412. Globe Savings bank against National Bank and Commerce. Error from Douglas. Affirmed. Duffie, C. division No. 1. A bank has the right to appropriate the funds of a depositor to the extent of the indebtedness due to the bank, but it is intended to charge a lien upon real estate to secure the payment of a specific debt, is sufficient to constitute a mortgage in this state.

11413. Bartos against Thomas. Appeal from Douglas. Affirmed with instructions. Holcomb, J. Where land is sold subject to a mortgage and the mortgagee is not a party to the transaction the land is the primary debtor and a sale thereof may be resorted to for the satisfaction of the mortgage.

11414. Lucas against Lucas. Appeal from Pierce. Affirmed. Holcomb, J. A mortgage on real estate is an incident to the debt evidenced by the notes it secures and passes with an assignment of the debt, and an unauthorized incumbrance of the mortgage would not prevent the enforcement of the rights of the holder of the note to a sale of the property in satisfaction of the debt as to any save those who in good faith and without notice have obtained title to such property, relying on the record which disclosed the apparent satisfaction of the incumbrance.
