HARD COAL OUT OF SIGHT WANTS STREETS KEPT CLEAN Local Supply Nearly Exhausted and No ter Ordinances. Prospect of Renewal.

EFFECTS OF STRIKE GENERALLY FELT Mine Owners Expect to Deal with

The anthracite coal supply in Omaha is becoming so short that jobbers have in some instances been compelled to refuse wholesale orders, and the reports from the coal fields are by no means reassuring. This week a local jobber received an order for two cars of hard coal for immediate delivery at a point on the Burlington road, and not having sufficient stock on hand to supply the demand sent the order to his Chicago correspondent. The answer to that letter has just been received and to the effect that the house would have to refuse the order as it had not sufficient coal to supply its regular customers. This company controls forty-nine collieries in the anthracite district of Pennsylvania and the manager writes that its shipping docks in Chicago are empty; that the supply in Pensylvania is low and that all it has control of is what is enroute from the melds to Chicago.

The manager adds; "There seems to be o new information about the strike; both sides are evidently determined in their position and it seems to be a test of endurance. No one, so far as I have been able to ascertain, has the slightest idea when the trouble will be adjusted."

Local Situation Discouraging. Locally the visible supply has been reduced by sales to consumers who have decided to lay in their fall supply at present prices. The rule adopted last spring as to the wholesale price of hard coal is still in force, which makes a low price in April bands-the first in all Italy, beyond quesin Chicago, advancing by stages of 10 cents a month per ton until September. "I see that the chief of police is preparing to enforce the ordinance against expectorating on steps and approaches to buildngs, etc.," said City Engineer Rosewater "That is all very well, but there are other ordinances that are now virtually dead letters so far as police regulation is concerned which could be enforced to better advantage. For example, there is the ordinance against the hauling of garbage through the

stronts in vehicles that leak and strew the refuse along the pavements. What is the use of our sweeping the streets if they are to be littered up in this way? Then there is the ordinance against dumping store sweepings in the gutters, and against dumping weeds cut from lots in the residence districts in the streets, to be swept into the catch basins and clog the sewers.

"The ordinance against hauling garbage through the streets in vehicles imperfectly constructed for the purpose has never been declared invalid by the courts. It is still in force, but it is not enforced. The courts have always held that the hauling of garbage must be subjected to regulatons, that it may not become a public rulsance. I think it will be well enough to regulate expectorating after some of these more serious matters have been regulated."

An ordinance against expectorating on sidewalks, on stairways, steps, approaches to buildings, in street cars, etc., was passed by the city council about nine years ago, but was afterwards amended by eliminating the word sidewalks. All the remainder of the ordinance is still in force.






TROUBLE WITH POLICEMAN Dr. Solomon and Officer Sawyer Clash and Police Court






