MAKERS CIGAR Manufacturers of Stogles, Cheroots and Other Cheap Cigars Form Combination,

PITTSBURG, Pa., July 18.-The stogie manufacturers of Pennsylvania, Ohio and West Virginia with but one exception have formed a combination and have been granted a charter by the state of Delaware. The combination will be known as the United States Cigar company. It is capitalized at \$7,500,900, of which \$2,500,000 will be cumulative preferred stock. The companies included in the merger

are: The Collins Cigar company Zuegschmidt Bros. of Pittsburg; the Union American Cigar company, M. Brilles & Co. and W. W. Stewart of Allegheny, E. Swisher & Co., Columbus, O.; Swisher Bros., Newark, O.; John Kildow, Tiffan, O.; Marsh & Sons, Wheeling, W. Va.; W. W. Blake Co., Altoona, Pa., and John Slater, Laucaster, Pa.

These with the R. and W. Jenkinson company of Pittsburg, which is not in the new concern, manufacture practically all of the stogies, cheroots and cheap cigars, the production outside of them amounting to scarcely 5 per cent. The annual product of the companies in-cluded in the new corporation is about
