

DENVER TAKES THE THIRD

Grizzlies Capture Game in Eighth Inning by Using the Stick. Omaha Starts Well by Making Two in First, but After That White-ridge Holds Rourke Men Down.

DENVER, July 27.—(Special Telegram.)—Omaha lost the third game of the series to the Cubs today by a score of 7 to 4. Denver won out in the eighth inning when they sent three men over the rubber.

The victory was due to the timely hitting of the Grizzlies, who wielded the wagon-tongue tirelessly, with Whiteridge as the star batter. The Denver twirler was only three times at bat and slammed the sphere safely every time up.

For the leaders Brown was in the best and pitched an excellent game, but was wild at critical moments and allowed the Grizzlies to walk when the best batters came to the rubber. The men from Rockville touched up Whiteridge for a total of six hits, but they were well scattered and they were not safe ones. Very few of them reached outside of the infield and the Denver men had no trouble in fielding them.

Omaha started the first inning with a great flurry and brought in two runs on a single by Stewart, who alarmed the spherer with two men on bases. The Grizzlies were unable to find their scoring man until the third inning when they got a hit erratic and was slammed for a few safe hits, which netted two runs, tying the score.
