#### Modern and Capacious Structure is Opened to the Public for First Time.

HASTINGS, Neb., Sept. 9 .- (Special.)-The new B. & M. depot was opened here yesterday and No. 6 was the first train to stop at that place. The dimensions of the building are 33x216, and there are 740 feet of sheds which are eighteen feet wide. The building is a handsome structure of St. Louis gray brick and was erected at the and was paroled on his good behavior. cost of \$70,000. There are eighteen rooms in the new depot and all are finished in oak. On the interior there is an opalite wainscoating eight feet high, which is capped with cut stone moulding. The roof forms the celling and it is paneled off with Oregon fir and yellow pine, finished in natural wood. The depot is brilliantly liluminated by 225 incandescent lights.




