EGAN IS THE STAR GOLFER

Plays a Magnificent Game in the Qualifying Round for Championship.

BREAKS THE RECORD FOR THE COURSE

Generally Higher Class Golf Than in Former Championships Contests of the Western Association.

CHICAGO, Sept. 10.—Initial play in the qualifying round for the western amateur golf championship was begun today on the links of the Chicago Golf club at Wheaton.

Most interesting feature about the competition for the George R. Thorne trophy, which is now held by Western Champion Phelps B. Hoyt, eighty-five of the best players of the crack western clubs being entered for the event.

The only prominent player who will not contest is Champion Lewis James, who is at Princeton. The qualifying round today was at medal play, thirty-six holes. A gold medal is the prize to the player making the lowest score in the qualifying round.

It is probable that double bogey—82 both out and in—will take the medal, and that all scores up to double bogey will qualify. Thirty-two players with lowest scores today will play off Thursday and Friday at eighteen holes, and the two survivors will play in the final Saturday at thirty-six holes. The Wheaton course is in excellent condition and the weather favors snappy playing.

Phelps B. Hoyt of Glenview, present western champion, withdrew from the contest after playing nine holes. He said he was not playing a good game and that further play was useless.

As playing progressed it became evident that low records would not prevail. A strong southwest wind swept the course and worked against the steadier players.

The prime favorite of the morning was H. Chandler Egan of Exmore, who made the record of the course yesterday in 78 strokes. Today his score for the first eighteen holes was: Out, 42; in, 44—86. Judging from his playing, critics think 171 will be low score. A number of players did not start, among them A. B. Poole, Jr., the well known Ontario player, and Stephen Bull of Racine and L. C.
