Quarantine

By reason of the fact that the health department took charge of the Vendome hotel in this city for quarantine purposes at the time of an outbreak of smallpox in that house in February, 1899, and continued in control there for the period of about one month, Andrew J. Hattery and Carrie Hattery, who were proprietors of the hotel at that time, have brought suit in the district court against the city of Omaha, demanding damages in the sum of \$4,754.76. The petition states that the Health depart-ment took full control of the hotel February 2, 1899, and remained in exclusive management of the premises as a quarantine hospital until March 3, 1898, using throughout that period the fuel, lights, furniture and other accommodations belonging to the plaintiffs, besides preventing the plaintiffs from carrying on the regular business of the hotel.
