

UNION IS NOT RECOGNIZED

Street Railway Company Declares Majority of Employees Have Not Joined.

LABOR LEADERS TELL DIFFERENT STORY

Some of the Employees Insist that More Than Half of the Motor-men and Conductors Are in the Union.

"We are not going to take any action at all now, we have not said a word to any of our men nor they to us, and no negotiations about the matter are pending between us," said an official of the Omaha Street Railway company when asked what new steps would be taken in the matter of the organization of the union by the motor-men and conductors on the local lines.

"We have no fight with our men; perfect peace and harmony exists between us and we have no desire whatever of antagonizing the men," said an official of the company. "and we believe the majority of them feel the same way toward us. In fact many of them have told us, so have given us their word for it, that they are not in any trouble, have no grievance and want none."

"Two hundred and seventy of the men now have these cards," said this gentleman. "It is obvious that this means of bringing the company to formally recognize the union has been decided upon by the street car men and those who are actively promoting their organization."
