RELIGIOUS.

Mr. Gould, the new apostolic delegate to the Philippines, will start for Manila early this month.

Mr. and Mrs. H. V. Baker, known as the blind evangelists, are conducting a singing campaign in Tacoma, Wash., and meeting with pronounced success.

After serving for a third of a century as pastor of the Tabernacle Presbyterian church, Philadelphia, Rev. Dr. Henry C. McCook has resigned his charge.

Rev. H. H. Jacobs has resigned the pastorate of the Hanover Street Congregational church of Milwaukee in order to devote his entire time to university settlement work.

The Chinese are now making a translation of the bible for themselves. This work is in progress under the imperial sanction

and is being performed by two of the first scholars of the empire.

H. C. Washburn of Boston has been training a chorus of 200 voices for the all New England convention of the Christian Endeavor societies to be held in Tremont temple October 14 to 17.

The American Bible society has recently issued its eighty-sixth annual report for the year ended March 31, 1902. The finances are in excellent condition, with receipts from the living of \$109,653 and legacies of \$112,902.

The American board has received through the United States department \$67,323, being one-quarter of the amount awarded to the board by the commission now in session in China for losses on mission property in the Boxer outbreak two years ago.

It is rumored in Episcopal circles in New York that Mrs. Arthur Corning Clark, who is to become the wife of Bishop Potter, has

decided to give \$5,000,000 toward the erection of the cathedral of St. John the Divine on the heights above Central park. The building is very dear to the heart of the bishop and he has labored long and anxiously for its advancement. Its great central arch looms up ominously against the sky as if appealing continually for more funds.

Milwaukee has a juvenile prodigy in the person of Lonnie Lawrence Dennis, a colored boy of 3 years who preaches the gospel and expounds the scriptures to large congregations at the colored Baptist church, and has made many converts.

Mother Katharine, head of the Order of the Sisters of Sacrament, who was formerly Mrs. Katharine Drexel of Philadelphia, is building a school for the Navajo Indians in the Arizona desert. On this reservation, the near Fort Defiance, are 20,000 Indians ignorant of the principles of Christianity.
