

THREE LINKS IN EVIDENCE

Large Attendance at Grand Lodge of Nebraska Odd Fellows.

SOCIALISTS CONTEST FOR A PLACE

Lincoln Man Insists that Pat Crowe as Mixed Up in the Recent Train Robbery at the Capital City.

LINCOLN, Oct. 14.—(Special.)—The Nebraska Odd Fellowship is in annual session in Lincoln and will continue so for three days. The series of meetings scheduled is almost continuous, and the attendance is said to be larger than has been customary in years past.

The opening meeting of the series was the session of the grand encampment in Odd Fellows' hall this morning, when the credentials of delegates were passed upon, the working committees appointed, and degrees conferred upon many of the members.

The grand lodge proper met for its initial session this evening, the representative hall at the state capital, after which the initiative and first degrees were conferred by the two Lincoln lodges, Nos. 11 and 128.

At the same time the Daughters of Rebekah were in session in the senate chamber.

After the assembly degree had been conferred on the visitors repaired to Odd Fellows' hall, where Charity lodge No. 2 of this city was working in the degrees.

Tomorrow morning a greatly enlarged attendance is expected and formal extension of welcome will occur in representative hall, Governor Savage delivering the address. Following the representative hall, the members of the order from out in the state will be held a reception, and at 11 a. m. the business session of the grand lodge will begin.

At 1:30 p. m., there will be a parade, in which visiting Odd Fellows, led by the Patriarchs' Militant, will traverse the principal streets. There will be a number of floats in the procession, representing phases of the secret work. Following the parade grand lodge work will be resumed.

In the evening at the Windsor will occur the department council of Patriarchs' Militant, while a meeting of past grand masters and patriarchs will be held at the same time at the Laddell. At 7:30 in the evening second degree work will be exemplified in representative hall by No. 128 of this city, and third degree work by No. 11.

At 9 o'clock Rebekah degree work will be shown by Columbia lodge No. 90 in Masonic hall, and a Rebekah reception will follow. The series of meetings will close Thursday morning with a grand lodge session in representative hall.

Reports of officers show three new camps organized in Nebraska during the year and an increase of 48 in membership.

Rival Socialist Tickets. Rival factions of the socialists presented to the secretaries of the order the credentials of each for a place upon the official ballot of its socialist ticket.

BIGGEST FISH GETS AWAY

Two Members of Mysterious Gang at Crete Indigo is Shooting Affray.

MAN WHO DOES THE SHOOTING ESCAPES

Others Arrested, but as Nothing Can Be Proven Against Them They Are Released After Night in Custody.

CRETE, Neb., Oct. 14.—(Special Telegram.)—Considerable mystery surrounds the suspicious action of a gang of strangers here yesterday. Some members of the gang have been shot and others arrested, and frequently they had various articles of clothing to dispose of.

Last evening two members of the gang apparently quarreled and exchanged shots at each other. As a result a bullet struck the watch of one of them and, shattering it, entered his side, where it lodged.

The wounded man affirms that the shooting was entirely an accident, but refuses to give his name or say anything regarding himself or companions.

Several of the gang were arrested and lodged in jail last night, but as no charge could be brought against the others, they were turned loose this morning.

The wounded man is well dressed and respectable looking. When arrested he carried a 38-caliber revolver and had considerable money. His wound, the doctors say, is not serious, and he will probably recover.

An operation will be performed this afternoon for the extraction of the bullet, and it is thought that the wound will not prove very serious. Though quite improbable, it is thought by some that the gang may have been implicated in the recent Burlington train robbery.

KNIGHTS OF PYTHIAS MEET

Grand Lodge of Nebraska Begins with an Open Session.

JUDGE ESTELLE WELCOMES DELEGATES

One of the Important Questions to Be Considered is Whether the Initiation Fee Should Be Increased.

The grand lodge of the Knights of Pythias, domain of Nebraska, convened in this city yesterday at Pythian hall in the Continental building with a larger representation than usual of the subordinate lodges.

The early portion of the morning was devoted to an open social session, beginning at 10 o'clock, at which Judge W. W. Slaughter was called to order promptly on the hour, and the visitors were welcomed to the city by Judge Lee Estelle, who said that he could not deliver or tender the keys of the city to the Knights of Pythias because of a man last summer.

At the session of yesterday afternoon, Grand Vice Chancellor Merrill Wilson of Indiana, addressed the convention on the subject of the insurance rank of the Knights of Pythias. The remainder of the afternoon was devoted to the presentation and consideration of the reports of the officers, and the adoption of resolutions.

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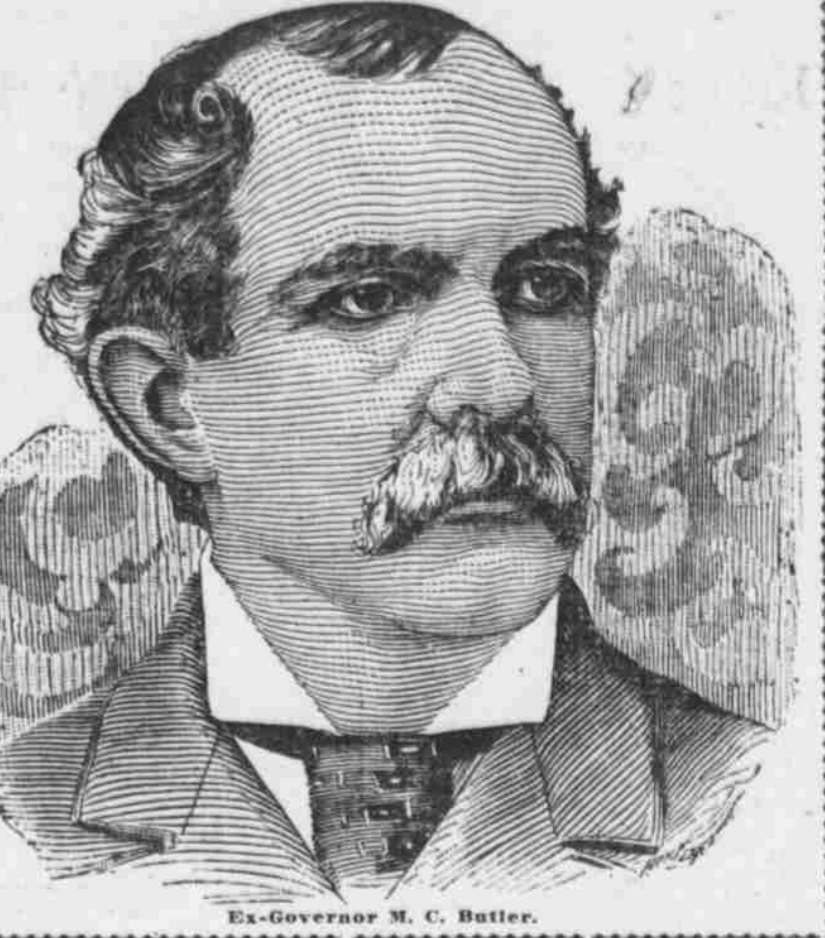
