Amalgamation of Extensive Interests on the Pacific Coast. CAPITAL IN DEAL TWENTY MILLIONS

Owners of Properties Receive Twenty Per Cent of Valuation in Cash and Balance in Bonds and Stocks.

SAN FRANCISCO, Nov. 6.—Confirming previous reports, the Call this morning says:

A deal is practically accomplished for the amalgamation of all the extensive flouring interests on the Pacific coast. It will take the form of a corporation with a capital of \$20,000,000 and facilities for supplying the present and prospective greater demands of the Pacific coast and of the Orient.

William Thomson of this city is now in the city in connection with the deal. The preliminary advances have made a few weeks ago by Mr. Thomson of the Continental Mills Co., and the offices of the Portland Flour Mills company.

Under the plan for financing the deal, says the Call, the owners of existing properties to receive on a fixed and agreed valuation of all their interests in cash and the remainder in bonds and stock to be issued by the new corporation to be formed to effect the amalgamation.
