Union Pacific Readily Accedes to Demands of the Committee.

INCREASE AMOUNTS TO TWELVE PER CENT

New Senle Adopted at Chicago to Go Into Effect at All the Yards on the Union Pacific System.

The Union Pacific switchmen have been granted a general increase in wages. This is the outcome of the demands presented by the Order of Railway Trainmen on the Union Pacific division. The demands were acceded to without hesitation and the new scale was signed yesterday afternoon by President Burt and Superintendent of Transportation Buckingham, with whom the negotiations were carried on. The committee representing the switchmen has been in the city only a few days and is highly pleased with results. The increase will affect all yardmen on the road, making a total of about 500 men.

The demands presented called for the new scale adopted at Chicago and this was Soda crackers, per lb ..... conceded in every detail. It means practically a 12 per cent increase to all switchmen and their helpers on the Union Pacifis. Those working in the standard yards will be paid for a ten-hour day and those in the intermediate yards for a twelveyards are these: Omaha, Cheyenne, Council Bluffs, Columbus, Kansas City, Laramie, North Platte, Grand Island, Rawlins, Hanna, Rock Springs, Ogden, Evanston, Denver, Granger, Junction City, Leaven-

Day foremen in these yards have been getting \$2.70 a day and under the new scale and neighbors for their kindness and servwill get \$2.10. Night foremen have been ices rendered, and the many floral designs getting \$2.90 and will get \$3.30. Helpers during the sickness and death of our befor day have been getting \$2.50 and are loved mother, Mrs. Mary Bohliver. given \$2.80. Night helpers are raised from \$2.70 to \$3.

Small Yards Included.

In the intermediate yards the same per cent of increase applies, but as men in these yards work twelve hours a day, they will get a proportionate rate.

The switchmen were given their increase after one short conference yesterday Superintendent Buckingham. They had no grievance to offer, save that they thought they were entitled to more money. The proposition seemed to appeal at once to the officials and the committee came away from headquarters building with the assurance that their demands were entirely satisfactory.

The switchmen emphasize the statement that their relations with the officials were entirely amicable and most cordial, and they express the utmost satisfaction with results. They call attention to the fact that the Union Pacific is the first road to

adopt the new Chicago scale. The prompt action of the Union Pacific in granting these demands has given rise to a suspicion that the severe strain of the present strike might have had some influence in shaping the company's attitude.
