

PACKERS FEAR ROOSEVELT

He is Said to Be One Cause of Delay in Their Merging.

WALL STREET SAYS COMBINE IS "SICK"

Plan Was for Extensive Underwriting, but the President's Attitude and the Greatness of the Amount Delay Consumption.

From South Omaha sources, ordinarily trustworthy, it is learned that one Theodore Roosevelt of Oyster Bay and Washington, D. C., is among the good and sufficient reasons for the very apparent delay in the consummation of the merger of the giant packing industries.

The Roosevelt informant concedes that these impediments will delay the arrival of the completed combine until next spring at the earliest. They deny, however, that the merger as a fact transaction or understanding is any less than consummated.

"Insiders in the deal," an authority is quoted as saying, "have raised approximately \$50,000,000, with which plans have been purchased, in order to be merged.

More Than a Minute's Work. Along this line the same New York authority is quoted as saying: "In view of the immense sums thus far expended in the acquisition of plants the necessity for \$50,000,000 of underwriting capital becomes more apparent.
