WANTS MORE BANK NOTES

Comptroller of Currency Pleads for Asset Currency.

WOULD PROTECT FINANCIAL SITUATION

Claims Banks Would Be Safer and Possibility of Big Undertakings Greater if Small Issues of Uncovered Bills Were Allowed.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 30.—The annual report of William B. Ridgely, comptroller of the currency, has been prepared for transmission to congress.

The report starts with a table giving a detailed statement of the resources and liabilities of all the banks of the United States, from which it appears that on September 15, 1902, 4,601 associations reported, with aggregate resources of \$5,112,928,910.50.

Dealings with asset currency the report says:
