FAVORS COMMITTEE TO INVESTIGATE

Adopts Resolution Declaring Pavor of he Action Until Special Investigation of Question is Completed,

A special meeting of the South Omaha Live Stock exchange was called yesterday for the purpose of conferring with reprecontations of the Western Nebraska Live Bluck Growers association, who were in the city. The principal subject under discussion was the bill now before congress known as Senate Pile 5886, which was introduced by Senator Districh. At a meeting held at Alliance Neb., November 19, the Western Nebraska Live Stock Growers' association adopted resolutions condemning the bill and it was also decided to send delegates to secure the aid of other stockmen in the defeat of the bill. After some dehate the following communication and resolution were adopted by the South Omaha Live Stock exchange: the South Omaha Live Stock exchange:

Homerable Senate and House of Representatives, Lincoln, Neb: Gentlemen—The South Omaha Live Stock exchange, an organization of over 20 members, who are also clossly identified with the live stock intercete of the state of Nebraska, respectfully represent that we have diligently inquired into the merits and demerits of Senate File 65%, which is a bill introduced in the senate of the United States, providing for a lesse law governing the control of the public domain in Nebraska, and to the hest of our knowledge it is not what the people of western Nebraska want.

He is therefore resolved by the Live Stock exchange, South Omaha, That we approve that portion of Fresident Reosevelt's message which recommende to congress the appointment of a committee to investigate the conditions surrounding the leasing of the public fands, and urgently request congress to authorize the president to appoint a committee to fully investigate the conditions relating to the leasing of the public grasing lands of Nebraska and pending such investigation and report to congress that no further action be taken.


