The committee on electing its work last evening had a list of over 150 signers to the membership roll and as there were 100 signers at the meeting last Wednesday night there will be little difficulty in swelling the roll to the desired 300 by tonight's session.

The committee consisting of H. A. Quinn, W. J. Davenport, F. J. Day, Ernest E. Hart and F. A. Hill, appointed to nominate fifty men to comprise the board of directors has made its selection, but the list will not be made public until the meeting tonight. The committee believes that every man selected by it will consent to serve on the board. In selecting this list of names for the board of directors the committee was careful in choosing men who represented the varied interests of the city.

With a membership of 300 it is believed that the club will be in a financial position to employ a commissioner who will also act as secretary, and pay him a salary of not less than \$2,500 a year. The general opinion appears to be that the club would not attain the desired results without the assistance of a qualified commissioner and secretary. Many of the leading business men are inclined to the opinion that it would be best to dispense with the proposed executive committee of five and leave the affairs of the club in the hands of a commissioner who would be under the direction of the board of directors. It is expected that this question will be brought before the meeting tonight for settlement.

JIM WEAVER STOPS A RAID

Declines to Allow a Railroad to Take Streets in His Town.

MAYOR OF COLFAX TO THE RESCUE

Effort of the Interurban Railroad to Lay Track Without Getting a Franchise Starts a Nice Row.

(From a Staff Correspondent.)

DES MOINES, Jan. 27.—(Special.)—The Des Moines Interurban Railroad company has encountered another obstacle to its progress eastward. This is in the shape of General James B. Weaver, mayor of the town of Colfax. The company has failed to secure a franchise in the town of Colfax, although a franchise was granted to another company which has not built. The line was built from Des Moines through Ankeny and Mitchellville to Colfax last fall, but stopped at the town limits. Nothing has been done in the way of getting through the town on the way to Newton, but it has been the understanding that the line would be extended early in the spring. Last night workmen commenced laying track in the streets of Colfax. This was discovered about midnight by citizens and a posse of sufficient size to overpower the workmen was quickly gathered and drove the workmen away. Then the track was torn up. Later in the night the workmen returned and commenced to lay the track again, but at daylight this morning Mayor Weaver ordered out the fire department and rescued the water on the employes of the Interurban company, driving them from the streets. Today President Polk, Superintendent Maish and Adjutant Scholes of the Interurban company went to Colfax in a special car to see if they could not adjust matters with the obstinate General Weaver. The mayor of Colfax, who is also called to the scene. The Colfax people declare they will not allow the company to get through their town until it has a franchise and has adjusted all matters with the town.

SATISFIED CASE DECIDED.

The famous case of Nannie Sutcliffe against the Iowa State Traveling Men's association was brought to an end in the supreme court this morning by a decision of the full court. Judge Bishop of the Polk county court and the decree for the defendant company. An accident policy for \$2,000 was involved. Sutcliffe was a member of the association in good standing. He was a traveling man and had been married about a year to a woman whose husband had gone to the penitentiary. Sutcliffe had been intimate with the woman for several years. They had removed to Chicago and lived in the same house with his mother and sister. One night about midnight, Sutcliffe came home from a roundup of the city where they had been drinking and quarreling and a few minutes later Sutcliffe was shot in his room. The revolver was inside of a grip when discharged. Mrs. Sutcliffe caught him and called others. The mother accused the wife of killing Sutcliffe and he said that he did it himself. At that time Mrs. Sutcliffe made an affidavit tending to show that it was accidental death. She supposed she was the beneficiary of his certificate. Later the certificate was found to be made out by a woman, Nannie Sutcliffe's mother. On the trial to recover in the certificate in Des Moines the wife appeared as a witness for the defense. The court decided it was a case of suicide and the supreme court so found today, hence the certificate is not collectable.

INSURANCE MONEY EXEMPTION.

One phase of the exemption statutes of Iowa was passed on by the supreme court today in a decision rendered in the case of Cook against Allee, from Benton county. The plaintiff had received \$2,000 insurance money on the death of her husband and had bought a house for herself and children, which she has continued to occupy. The defendant had procured judgment against her on a debt contracted before she received the insurance money and sought to secure it by sale of her house and lot. She claimed the house and lot to be exempt because the statutes of Iowa provide that insurance money shall be exempt from debts contracted previous to its receipt by either the beneficiary or the deceased. The court in a decision prepared by Judge Sherwin reviews the legislation on this subject and shows that the clear intent of the legislators was that the insurance money should be exempt. It follows that property purchased with the insurance money is also exempt from execution on debts, the same as pension money and homesteads.

HEARING ON CROSSING CASE.

The railroad commissioners of Iowa had a hearing today in a case involving the duty of railroad companies in the matter of farm crossings. The case was one of a number from Keokuk county, where the demand was made for an open crossing, which would include cattle guards, so that the livestock could go at will across the railroad tracks. The case was extensively argued by Carroll Wright for the Rock Island and railroad and for the farmers by C. T. Jones. While it involves only a comparatively small expense in Keokuk county, the railroads object to a precedent being set of ordering the cattle guards and open crossings, as it might mean a demand from many farmers for similar crossings. The case has not yet been determined.

IMPROVING THE CAPITOL.

It is expected that the state capital improvement commission will return again from an extensive eastern trip of inspection of public buildings, with a view to getting ideas for the adornment of the Iowa state capital. In the meantime, the superintendent employed under the commission has a force at work making repairs on the capitol, and this week has begun the work of making improvements on the capitol. The work this winter is to be confined largely to closing up the joints in the stone and woodwork and the revarnishing and repainting of the interior. When the commission has returned some of the
