Sizack by Train. Oscar Skoglum of Ceresco, Neb., is at St. Elizabeth hospital as a result of coming in contact at his home town with the front end of the Elkhorn passenger train, due here at 11:40.

Skoglum was in a top buggy driving across the track and did not notice the approaching train. The buggy was struck square in the center and smashed to splinters. The team was uninjured.

Skoglum was thrown several feet in the air, and was picked up unconscious. He was taken aboard the train and brought to Lincoln, where it was found his right leg was broken above the knee. He regained consciousness after reaching Lincoln, and is now resting well.

CRUSHED UNDER A TREE

YORK, Neb., Feb. 10.—(Special.)—If the county bridge contractors of Nebraska are in a combine their representatives received a job here yesterday in the awarding of the county contract for the year 1903 which they will hang tomorrow, and the taxpayers of York county hereafter will not pay as much for their county bridges as many other counties in the state. The contract was awarded to a home company after a vigorous protest from outside bidders.

COMMENCE ON LILLIE CASE

General Opinion It Will Require All of Present Week to Secure Jury.

DEFENDANT APPEARS IN CH. ERILL MOOD

Preliminary Proceedings Attract Only a Small Crowd to the Courtroom—Large Number of Witnesses Summoned.

DAVID CITY, Neb., Feb. 10.—(Special.)—When district court convened this morning the case of the State versus Lillie and M. Lillie, charged with murdering her husband, Harvey Lillie, on the morning of October 24, 1902, was called and the impaneling of the jury was commenced.

Mrs. Lillie arrived at the court room promptly on time, accompanied by her father, Mrs. Mary Lillie and Sam Lillie, mother and brother of Harvey Lillie, and occupied the same seat that she did at the preliminary hearing. She seems quite cheerful for one charged with a crime so serious as that of murder in the first degree.

Last Friday morning defendant's attorney filed objections to Sheriff West assuming to act as juror for the reason he is an interested witness for the state. Judge Good made an order that all witnesses should be called by Deputy Sheriff Joseph B. Varin. In addition to the regular panel of twenty-four jurors twenty-eight talesmen were summoned to appear tomorrow morning.
