Little Interest is Manifested by Board of Trade Brokers. AFTER FAIR OPENING GRAINS DROP

Provisions, However, Influenced by Short and Home Demand, Some May Products Rise from Two and Half to Fifteen Cents.

CHICAGO, March 4.—There was little of interest in trading on the Board of Trade today and after a short run of strength the grain markets closed easy. May wheat being off 1/8c, corn down 1/8c and soybeans down 1/8c.

Wheat market was influenced largely by the action of corn and followed the price of that cereal throughout the day. Trading was dull and confined chiefly to local traders. The opening was easier on receipts of 200 cars, which, with local receipts of 40,000 car, against 60,000 car, Minneapolis and Duluth reported receipts of 100,000 car.
