COUNCIL BLUFFS.

FEDERAL COURT CONVENES

Little Civil or Criminal Business to Dispose of This Term.

GRAND JURY RETURNS TWO INDICTMENTS

Receiver is Appointed for a Small Railroad Operating Between Muscatine and Elitch Junction.

Judge Smith McPherson convened the spring term of federal court in this city yesterday morning. The grand jury was convened, returned two indictments, the only cases presented to it, and then adjourned.

On application of the New York Security and Trust company Judge McPherson appointed Charles Howard receiver of the Muscatine, North & South railroad company. The company operates a line of twenty-eight and one-half miles between Muscatine and Elitch Junction and the trust company holds \$450,000 of its bonds.

One of the two indictments returned by the grand jury was against George F. Eades, a dentist, charged with counterfeiting \$10 gold pieces. Eades pleaded guilty to the charge both before the grand jury and before the court.

The other indictment was against Frederick Kuehnel, formerly postmaster at Westphalia, Ia. Kuehnel when checked up last January by Inspector Craig was found to be \$500 short in his accounts.

The matter of the Elgin Creamery company bankruptcy case was argued before the court, who took the matter under advisement.

In the suit of M. H. Free against The Western Union Telegraph Company for damages for failure to deliver a message in due time a motion for removal to the district court was filed by the plaintiff.

The suit of John R. Webster of Omaha against John T. Rew, involving a chattel mortgage on cattle in Des Moines county, was committed to next term on application of the defendant.

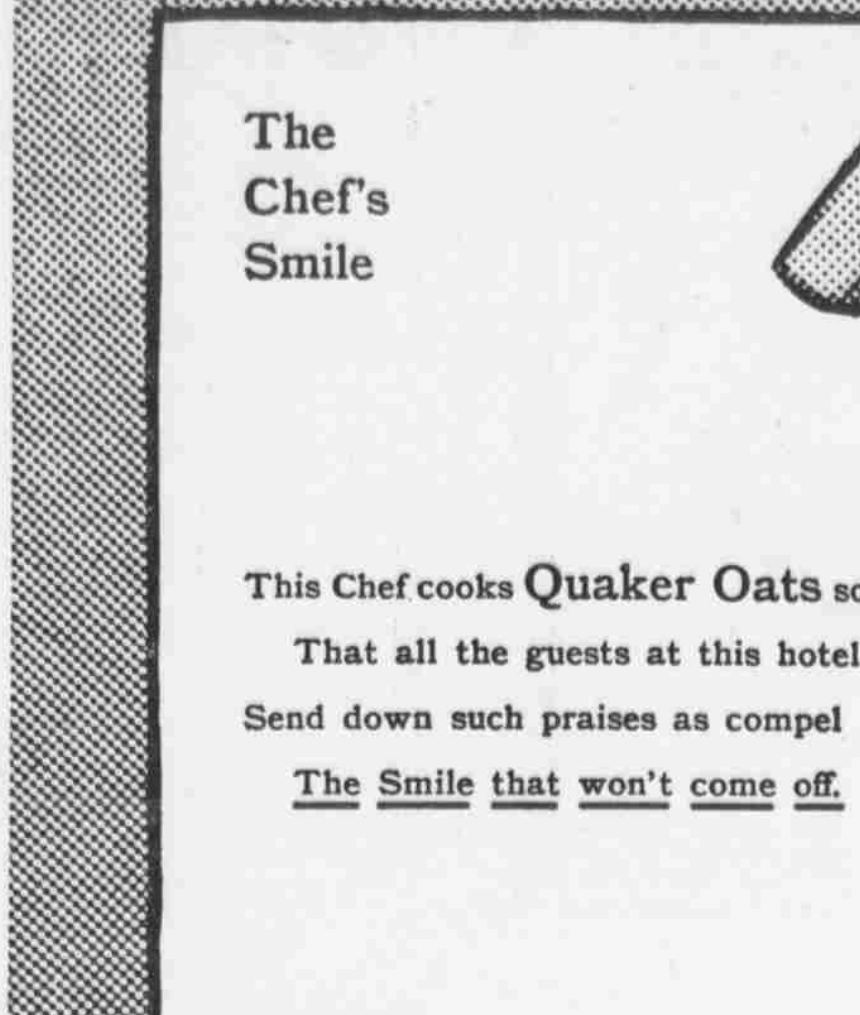
