Board of Trade Business Variable, Some Products Rising, Others Falling. BULLS DOMINANT IN WHEAT PIT

CHICAGO, April 8.—There was decidedly bullish sentiment in the wheat pit today and the close showed a gain of 1/4c for May. May corn was up 1/4c, but oats were lower. Provisions were strong and the day's products were generally higher.

There was a moderate tendency in corn and the market was firm influenced mainly by the strength in wheat and by the lifting of the embargo on shipment of wheat to the east and consequent cash demand from the east and consequent result in reduction in local stocks. Corn advanced 1/4c to 1/2c. Oats were up 1/4c to 1/2c. Wheat was up 1/4c to 1/2c.
