

MORAL NOT PHYSICAL FORCE

Conditions in Ireland Improved by More Conservative Procedure.

FARMERS ARE COMING TO OWN THE LAND

Changes That Have Been Wrought by the Reforms in Land Laws and Bright Prospects for the Future.

"We have seen more physical force in Ireland in the last eighteen months than the blatherers in America will see in eighteen years."

Mr. Devlin was speaking of the condition of Ireland and used the language quoted when asked what he thought of the position taken by the physical force party. He continued:

"In the twenty-five years the constitutional efforts to ameliorate the condition of Ireland have been in progress we have accomplished more for Ireland than previous centuries of physical force effort which preceded it."

Some Changed Conditions. "The constitutional party made its first success when it secured the secret ballot, a result of this being that eighty-five members of Parliament were returned to secure further concessions from the government."

Improvements in Land Laws. "In addition to this we have forced an unwilling ministry to pass a new land purchase act. We desired an act which would make the sale of land compulsory on the part of the landlord."

JURY FINDS MCGUIGAN GUILTY

Lawyers for the Prisoner Argue on Theory of Self-Defense.

THEY CONTENTED MURPHY WAS AGGRESSOR

County Attorney Undertakes to Convince the Jurors that McGuigan Drew the Knife, Expecting to Do Stabbing.

The jury in the trial of Thomas McGuigan, charged with the degree of murder because he stabbed John Patrick Murphy back of the left ear and in the left side the evening of February 23, brought in a verdict of guilty of murder in the second degree yesterday afternoon.

The jury occupied several days before Judge Estelle in district court and the argument was begun and finished yesterday forenoon. Attorney L. J. Platt took the initiative for the defense and went over most of the ground, Attorney C. W. Britt speaking only briefly to emphasize the importance of the evidence sustaining the theory of self-defense.

Prosecuting Attorney's Talk. County Attorney English and Deputy Burham attacked this line of defense with vigor, maintaining that a small rent in McGuigan's shirt collar was about the only tangible evidence in support of the self-defense theory.
