A. S. Orne of Chicago is in the city in the interest of a juvenile court and to confer with Mayor Moores on the subject. He is the originator of the juvenile court law of Illinois and has for twenty years or more interested himself along these lines. He expressed himself as much disappointed over the veto of the juvenile court bill by Governor Mickey, and will visit the governor at Lincoln to discuss the matter with

"From personal investigation of the charitable and corrective institutions of the United States, it is demonstrated that we are raising a crop of criminals, springing invariably from the independent or homeless children that have been permitted to run at large in the streets of the slums. From this class over seventy-five per cent of the criminal classes have been recruited during the past ten years. Prior to the enactment of the juvenile court law of Il-linois from 600 to 800 boys were sent annually to the Cook county jail, and these were under 16 years of age. Since the en-actment of that law there have been only twenty boys sent to the same jail in Chicago. Special places of detention are provided for the boys, where they are taught useful trades and how to become useful citizens. Only the wholly incorrigible boys are sent to the state reformatory.


