ENJOINS WOMAN FROM TALKING

Judge Baxter Signs Latest Novelty i Way of Temporary Restraining Order,

The latest restraining order issued by a judge of the district court in Omaha enjoins a woman from talking. It was issued yesterday upon the complaint of L. Oliphant Dodge of Twenty-first and Nicholas streets, who has appealed to the courts to protect her from the words and actions of one Mrs. E. Berge, a neighbor. 
