June 22, 1900; The past week has been cool, with moderate showers. The dally mean temperature has averaged 4 degrees below normal Judge William Van Benthuysen, father of in eastern counties and 2 degrees below in western.

Showers occurred guite generally during the last half of the week: the amount of rainfall in most of the eastern portion of the state ranged from one-half an inch to an inch, but in some cases it exceeded two inches. Winter wheat continues to do well, although most wheat fields are affected more or less by rust. Onts are beginning to head. and in some instances with rather short straw.
