LIKES THE CAMP GROUNDS

Committee of Uniform Rank K. of P. Inspects Shady Grove.

EXPECT LARGE ATTENDANCE OF ORDER

Grand Lodge Knights of Klhorassan and Rithbone Sisters Will Also Be Here During August.

"They are the best camp grounds we have ever had in this state," was the declaration of General Manchester and the officers of his staff yesterday afternoon after inspecting Shady Grove at Lake Manawa, which has been selected for the encampment of the Uniform Rank, Knights of Pythias, in August.

The encampment will open Sunday afternoon, August 9, and it is expected that between 400 and 500 members of the Uniform Rank will be in camp.

While the tents will be pitched in Shady Grove, the reviews and dress parades will be held in the large field outside the enclosure.

During the encampment the election of brigade officers will be held.

The week of August 10 will be Pythian week, as besides the encampment of the Uniform Rank, the grand lodge will be in session and the Dramatic Order Knights of Klhorassan will hold its annual meeting and entertain with its burlesque and vaudeville.

The Iowa brigade of the Uniform Rank, Knights of Pythias, is composed of four regiments, with a total membership of nearly 1,000.
