TO MAINTAIN RURAL ROUT

Must Be Three Thousand Pieces Handled

Eacı Every Month.

FARMERS SHOULD TAKE DAILY PAPE

Superintendent Rathbone Sugge that Increase of Circulation of Dailies May Be the Means of Saving Many Routes.

Nothing definite has yet been acco plished by the meeting of the eight special field agents of the western d sion of the rural free delivery serv now assembled here. From some of observations reported by the agents looks as if a numb .. of rural routes : have to be abandoned unless the reorder of the Postoffice department requ ing that at least 100 familles must be trons of a route to insure its maintena and that at least 3,000 pieces of mail must be delivered or received per month. There is no restriction as to the classification of the mail matter.

"It is the decision of the department," said Superintendent Rathbone, "to make the rural free delivery service just as efficent as possible. It rests with the patrons of the routes to secure their permanency. The more mail matter they receive and send, the better for the route. With the present facilities every farmer should take a daily paper; this would help out amazingly in the aggregate. In Indiana the dally papers have very largely increased their circulation by systematicalworking up the rural mail routes and as consequence the amount of first class mail matter has also largely increased on these routes. The same thing could be done in Nebraska."

"I do not wish to be understood as dic tating to the newspapers as to what they should do, but with them lies a practical solution of the perpetuation of some of the rural routes that must sooner or later be abandoned because of the meager patronage along them. This we do not want to see done, but our orders are imperative and we have no recourse but to obey, unlivered or received during the calendar month."


