REQUEST FOR HIGHER WAGES

Street Railway Men Submit Matter to International Officers for Approval.

ASK FOR TWENTY-FIVE CENTS AN HOUR

Also Request Minimum Daily Wage of One Dollar for Extra Men-Members of Union Say Strike is Improbable.

By the action of the second section of the Street Rallway Employes' union Wednesday afternoon there will be submitted to the international officers of that organization for approval the request of the local union for an increase in the wages of the men employed by the Omaha

& Council Bluffs Street Rallway company, The action taken was after considerable discussion of the subject, which followed the adoption of the same measure by the section of the union which met last Wednesday night. The request of the union is for a change of two features of the present scale. The first and most important is an increase in the wages of the motormen and conductors to 25 cents an hour, and the second a minimum daily wage of \$1 extra for men who may be called upon to work. At the present time the extra men are required to report at the office for duty and are paid only for trips made. Some of them may remain at the barns all day, according to statements of members of the union, and not take out a train, and they consequently get no pay for the time they are on waiting orders.

It is understood that when the application of the union for the approval of the demands is sent to the international headquarters some of the members of the organization will send a statement of the conditions existing in Omaha to President Mahon to acquaint him with conditions, and ask him to be very cautious in giving any approval which will lend color to reports of trouble to be coming at Omaha, as the men who voted to ask for the increase in wages do not desire to carry their demands to the point of suspending

Strike Is Not Probable.

It is said by members of the union that in case the request is approved by the in-ternational officers and is refused by the company that the matter would be allowed to drop before any question of suspending work would be submitted to the local of ganization. There can be no strike until two-thirds of the members of the union vote for such action, and this is impossible, in the opinion of the strongest champions of the new scale, as including both meetings at which the question was submitted less than half the membership voted on the question of the present application for permission to send the request for higher wages to the company.

By a new rule, effective August 1, the two sections of the union will meet upon the same day, the night men in the afternoon and the day force in the evening. Heretofore the night force has met on the first and third Wednesday afternoons and the day force on the second and fourth Wednesday evenings.,
