CITY TAXES ARE NOT VOID

Judge Munger's Decision is Y. M. C. A. Case Has No General Application.

WILL NOT BENEFIT PROPERTY OWNERS

Supreme Court Decisions Against Canl cellation of Regular Taxes Even if No Board of Equalization

Judge Munger's decision declaring the regular city taxes for 1896 and 1897 invalid to City Treasurer Hennings and former Assistant City Attorney Adams. While they take no issue with Judge Munger in say the assertion that the regular gity taxes are void has no general application Should there be any attempt at evasion in the courts it is bound to be defeated, they state, and Mr. Adams points to numerous authorities and past decisions to bear him

Treasurer Hennings has been somewhat worried over the bold statements in two newspapers that Judge Munger had found the 1896 and 1897 city taxes illegally levied because of improper notice of the Board of Equalization sittings. There are approximately \$150,000 of back taxes for the two years standing on the books and the treasurer is of the opinion that liquidation will be retarded unless the situation is ex-

No Board Necessary,

bring a successful suit against the city to erty owner is exempted from paying regular taxes. The broad view taken by the courts is that all property-owing citizens are in duty bound to bear their fair share of the expenses in maintaining government. . Where a case is brought in a court of equity by a property owner dissatisfied with his taxes it must be to secure an equalization and with the view having a reduction made, and not to have the taxes wiped off the books altogether.

had a case involving those points before Judge Day. The title of the suit was Heffrom against The City of Omaha and concerned regular taxes, sought to be evaded by showing incorrect technicalities in the manner the assessment and levies were made. A whole day was spent in argument and authorities and decisions were scarched out and presented. The case was won by the city, Judge Day following the precedent established by the supreme court in Nebraska and other states.

"The case in the federal court was an attempt to secure the foreclosure of a tax certificate. The plaintiff relied for recovery upon the regularity of the certificate which he purchased. If this certificate be faulty or nothing in a straight suit to enjoin the collection of regular taxes. "So far as the 1892 county tax is con-

erned, I think that it would be impossible o evade payment on the grounds that the 15 mill levy limitation had been exceeded. The taxes might be reduced, but hardly would be cancelled by the court."
