DOCTORS RATHER SKEPTICAL

NEW YORK, July 28.—Regarding the recent experiments of an Anderson (Ind.) physician, who claims he succeeded in creating life in the form of animated substances resembling well developed germs of life and trilobites, doctors at the Pasteur Institute declare, says the Paris correspondent of the Herald, that the atoms developed and were either attached to the walls of the tube or were present in substances used in the experiment.

REPORTS ASYLUM ABUSES
