CORONER'S JURY SAYS IT WAS SUICIDE

Dead Man Was a Cudahy Packing House Foreman and Leaves Sick Wife and Family of Small Children.

Suspended by the neck from a rope tied to a small bridge in Riverview park, the body of John Bartel, a foreman for the Cudahy Packing company, was found yesterday afternoon by two little boys, Edward Palm and King Gaston, members of a picnic party composed of the pupils of the Sunday school of St. John's church.
