Then Pa Bill's battered warriors faced Hart again. Genina was erased at first and Miller fattened his batting average with a single and promptly stole second. Thornton was waiting at the plate for a good one and when it came along he just lit it hard enough to bring Miller in with the winning run.

In the second game Sanders started in to pitch for the locals and friend for Peoria. Right from the start Friend had the better of it, although Sanders kept the hits scattered until the fifth, when three singles in a row and a bad throw of Thomas brought in two runs.
