### LOCALS FIRST OF SEPTEMBER

Great Western Arranges to Enter Omaha Within Two Weeks.

### UNRELIABLE RUMORS.

Electric Light Company Warns Public Against Rumors in Circulation.

### OFFICIALS LOOK OVER LOCAL TERMINALS

Ascertain Themselves with Conditions So as to Be Ready for Entrance with Both Passenger and Freight.

It has come to our notice that those interested in preventing this city substituting electric lights for gas and gasoline street illumination, at a saving of many thousands of dollars per year to the taxpayers, are resorting to many methods to deceive the public and thus array Omaha's citizens against such a proposition.

We urge our citizens to bear in mind that no proposition from this company has been made to the city, consequently all of the idle stories now in circulation are based solely upon rumor and not upon fact.

September 1 the council will receive bids from the electric light company and the gas company. Thus it will be seen that any discussion of this matter at this time is not only premature, but is entirely based upon conjecture.

Therefore we caution our citizens to pay no attention to statements of parties interested in defeating a proposition of great interest to the city, and regarding which we court the fullest investigation as to its merit and utility.

We are confident that a public investigation of the methods of street lighting which have prevailed in the past when compared with the system we propose will result in an overwhelming sentiment in favor of our proposition.

The Great Western will be running trains, passenger and freight, to Omaha at the Union station September 1. They will be only local trains, however. The regular through service will not begin until two or four weeks later, as was given out by President Stokney when here last week. The information regarding the local trains comes from Superintendent G. A. Goodell, who, with O. Cornelissen, superintendent of the Fort Dodge & Omaha division; W. H. Causey, superintendent of the Mason City & Fort Dodge division, and General Agent Thomas, who has charge of the local interests of the Great Western in Omaha and Council Bluffs, spent Monday in the three cities inspecting the Union Pacific and Union station facilities. The party was shown around by Superintendent R. W. Baxter of the Union Pacific.

The mutual agreement between the Union Pacific and Great Western for the entrance of the latter's local trains at this early date discredits all thought of the Union Pacific further pushing its case to keep the Stokney road out of Omaha. It is generally understood, now, that the Harriman road has abandoned any hope of success from the appeal it took from Judge Munger's decision.

### Carefully Inspect Terminals.

The officials Monday made a careful inspection of the general situation here, taking notes as to what extra trackage was needed, as the general plans for switching and admitting the incoming line. The local trains can, it is found, get into the city without waiting for the enlargements that are to be made for the permanent service. The Union Pacific is busy with plans for these enlargements. It is now about certain that the iron fencing separating the Union station yards from the Burlington and those outside the fence will have to come down and moved further south. Probably two new tracks will be laid. Most of the tracks outside the Union station yards belong to it, so that it will not be necessary, it is now thought, to link up with the B. & M.

Chief Engineer Berry of the Union Pacific has just arrived from an extensive trip over the main line and Kansas division of the road, where he has been busy engaged in conducting improvements, and he will now address himself to perfecting the details of the Union station plans, preparatory to the Great Western's entrance.
