Symphony Company Announces Its Projection, with Bellstedt as the Leader.

Plans Are Advanced to Create a Musical Center and Have a Band that Will Enjoy National Repute.

Belistedt probably will remain in Omaha and conduct a symphony orchestra and nilitary band, the equal of the musical organizations with which he formerly visited this city, and in addition will become head of an Omaha college of music. That is, if cess meets the attempt to form a symphony company which is being made by shout thirty prominent business men. A circular, which is signed by Jay J. Foster as secretary of the Omaha Symphony company, states that it is the intention to establish such a company in the city, with Herman Bellstedt as leader, for the object of creating a musical center to elevate the standard of musical art, "to locate with us a master conductor, to maintain a school of nusic for advanced pupils for this section of the country, to promote in Omaha a military band that shall have a national reputation, to secure the permanent establish ment of a symphony orchestra that will produce high class music, raising the standard of music to the highest elevation."

Money is all that is needed. To accomplish the purpose, it is proposed to organize a symphony company of fifty players that shall give a series of twelve evening concerts in Boyd's during the season between cember 8 and the last of April. This will cost \$3,000.

To raise this amount season books will be sold for \$6 in blocks of five or more and a general admission of \$1 charged. A subscription blank accompanies the circular. The men who are attempting to organize symphony company must know in a few days whether or not the necessary funds can be subscribed. Those interested obtain one from Mr. Foster in the offices at the Krug theater. of H. E. Palmer & Son in the Merchants National bank building. The association will be managed by twelve citizens as a directorate and any surplus arising from the concerts will be used in organizing the musical college and the military band.
