Markets for All Grains Strong and Active at Chicago Wednesday.

UNFAVORABLE REPORT OF NORTHWEST

Strong Foreign Markets and Small Receipts Cause Urgent Demand from Both Commodities Houses and Shippers.

CHICAGO, Sept. 2.—The grain markets were all strong and active.

From nearly every section of the northwest came accounts of distinctly unfavorable character regarding weather and crops. Added to these were the influences of strong foreign demand.

There was but little corn offered for sale and shorts ran high during the first half hour's trading.

Local buyers were not particularly active, but the close showed a gain for September of 1c, at 51 1/2c.
