AFFAIRS AT SOUTH OMAHA

Pco's of Stagnant Water Over City Caus

Much Complaint.

EFFORT IS TO BE MADE TO DRAIN THEM Fact that No Member of Police Force Has Given Bond is the Ocea-

sion for Considerable

Comment Over City. Sanitary Inspector Frank Jones will busy imself this week attempting to drain the different stagnant ponds of water which are scattered throughout the city. Complaint has been coming in this week in wholesale fashion and Mr. Jones says that if it is necessary he will file complaints against the owners of the property where

the ponds are located. The worst of these miniature lakes seems to be near the intersection of Thirtyseventh and L streets. Here a body of water covering an area of almost two acres has formed. The water is the result of the heavy rains and no natural putlet being present, there seems no handy way in which the same may be drained. This pool has become extremely stagment, as refuse matter has been promisencus'y While the majority of the land on which this body of water stands is owned by the stock yards company, Mr. Jones stated that he was in doubt as to whose duty it

was to drain the place. An investigation will be part of his work. There are several other bad places of this kind. At Thirty-third and Q at ects the natural depression of the ground has formed a pond of almost an acre, and while there has been no foreign matter thrown into the water that neighborhood is clamoring to have it removed, saying that it is both dangerous and disagreeable. This place will undoubtedly have to be

drained at the city's expense. At Thirty-sixth and S streets there is another natural depression of about one and one-half acres. This water has stood in the present place almost the entire summer and the odor arising from it is extremely disagreeable.

There are many pools in the eastern part of the city which for a long time have baffied the authorities in their attempt to have them removed. At the foot of Fourteenth and M streets there is a deep hollow and in this a great body of water has formed. There is absolutely no outlet to it and no way of removing the water except by pumps. These streets in this place have never been opened by the city, At the latter place a young man by the

name of Broderick was a few days ago injured, and a claim will probably be filed with the city today, asking damages by reason of the same. While the city disclaims any responsibility, the officials are very anxious to rid themselves of these continuous eyesores.

May Inquire About Police. The fact that none of the police officers of the city has given an official bond has led up to the question as to whether any of the parties who now wear stars are authorized to make arrests, and, after

uch an attempt has been made, whether the act is legal or not.
