

LINCOLN, Neb., Oct. 12-(Special Telegram .- The State Board of Equalization, t will be under the new revenue law, held an informal meeting this afternoon and selected George Bennett of the auditor's office for it's secretary. He will not be formally appointed until the December meeting, the action today being taken in order that he would have time to prepare the blanks to send out after the first meeting. The office carries with it a salary of \$1,000 a year and the term is four years. Bennett has heretofore acted as secretary of the old board and at the same time held a place in the auditor's office.
