

LEVI CARTER PASSES AWAY

Pioneer Business Man of Omaha Dies at Paxton Hotel Apartments.

FUNERAL WILL BE PRIVATE AFFAIR

President of Carter White Lead Company, Whose Chicago Plant is Largest in the World.

Levi Carter, one of the wealthiest and oldest inhabitants of Omaha, died yesterday morning at 4 o'clock in his apartments at the Paxton hotel. He was 70 years old and had been ill a week with bronchitis and acute Bright's disease.

Biggest Plant in the World. In 1886 Mr. Carter took control of the Carter White Lead company, outgrowth of white lead, the concern growing under his management to be the greatest of its kind in the United States, having factories at Omaha and Chicago.

Speaking of the deceased, a friend who had known him for many years said: "Mr. Carter has long been considered one of our most honorable, broad-minded and conservative business men, and his death will be mourned by many friends throughout the west."
