PROPERTY OWNERS TO BE NOTIFIED

After Two Weeks' Publication Appraisers May Proceed with Their Work on N Street Property.

Notice was sent yesterday to A. H. Murdoch, city attorney, to the effect that the appraisers appointed in the N street condemnation proceedings had qualified.

It will now be the duty of the city attorney to notify those whose property is involved that the appraisers have qualified.

Two weeks' notice, to allow for protests, must be given. It is presumed that this notice will be given by publication.

After the two weeks' publication the appraisers may proceed with their work. When a report is received from the appraisers the city attorney will proceed to take the proper steps in the courts to condemn the property ordered.

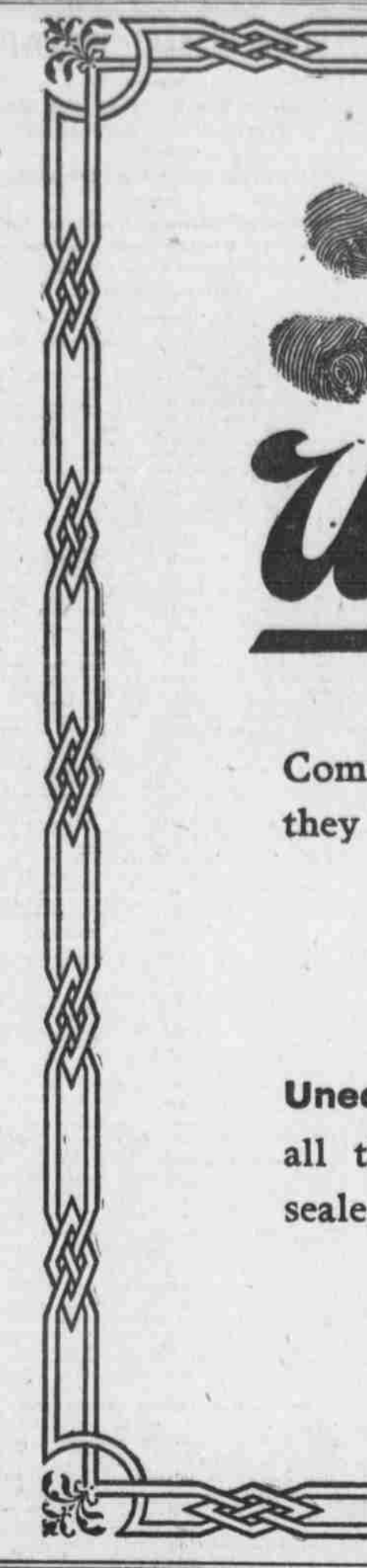
