SIGN CONTRACT FOR HOSPITAL
Methodist Authorities and Bookers & Gould Complete Preliminary Steps.

WORK ON BUILDING STARTS THIS FALL
Structure to Occupy Eminent Site at Glenwood Avenue and Cumins Street and Be Ideal in Workmanship.

"A contract was signed up with Rochester & Gould, contractors, Thursday night calling for the partial construction of the proposed Methodist Episcopal hospital."

"The boiler house and laundry and the operating pavilion, both two-story brick and stone structures, will be carried to completion this fall and the central portion of the main ward building will be carried up to the first story."

"The plans of the new hospital, now in the office of Architect Thomas R. Kimball, 222 McCaskey block, call for a prestigious group of buildings, the whole to compose what will be known as the Methodist Episcopal hospital and to be located on an elevated plot of ground eminently suited as hospital site at Glenwood avenue and Cumins street."

"The main hospital building will have a frontage of nearly 300 feet on Cumins street overlooking the prettiest part of Bemis park. The main hospital building—or ward building—has a central elevation of five stories, with four wings branching out from its four corners diagonally, each of which will be three stories high when completed."

"The operating pavilion, which is to be built this fall, stands immediately back of the center of the main structure and some fifty feet to the rear of the operating pavilion, the boiler room and laundry is to be constructed. East of the operating pavilion a high intake shaft, or chimney, is to be erected. It is octagonal in shape and will rise to the height of about thirty feet. Through this intake shaft fresh air will be supplied to the main building."

To Be Fireproof.
The entire group of buildings, consisting of the main ward building with its four large wings, the operating pavilion and the combined boiler house and laundry, are to be constructed of brick, stone and iron, with a view to rendering them absolutely fireproof. The original plans called for "below burning" buildings, but these have been changed to the end that as nearly as possible in modern architecture fireproof buildings will be erected.
