FAITH CURE A CRIME

So Rules the New York Court of Appeals in Case of Death Caused by Negligence.

Dependence upon faith healing in sickness is declared to be criminal negligence in a decision handed down by the New York court of appeals last Monday.

The conviction was secured under the penal code, which holds that "a person who commits an act which causes the death of another and which he knows to be dangerous to the life of another, and which he knows to be negligent, is guilty of murder in the second degree."

Justice Bartlett, in the prevailing opinion in the appellate division, held that the medical attendance referred to in the statute does not mean exclusively the attendance of a medical practitioner in the general sense of the term, and the appellate division reversed the conviction.
