Prisoners Got from One to Fourteen Years at the State Prison.

DES MOINES HOTEL INTO PROMINENCE

Judge Estelle Declares that He is Determined to Brenk Up Crime of Entering Private

Judge Estelle, in the criminal division of the district court, yesterday sentenced. Andrew Tucker, colored, to fourteen years at hard labor in the state penitentlary for murder in the second degree.

Tucker was convicted of the killing of Hiram Sappho in the Des Moines house in South Omaha last July. This was the first of three colored murders that have been committed within one block of this place past. Two weeks ago M. C. Wynn, colored, killed Dan Cashin, colored. Last Sunday night Ike Chambers, colored, killed his brother, Joe.

James Hunter, convicted of entering tha place of business of D. A. Hart and stealing goods to the value of \$30, was sentenced. to four years in the penitentiary.
