

## GRAINS AND PRODUCE MARKET

**Delay in Harvesting in Argentine Causes Strength in Wheat Market**

**CORN PRICES ARE SOMEWHAT HIGHER**

**GATE ARE Firm, with Both Longs and Shorts Purchasing, While Provisions Keep the Prices Up.**

**CHICAGO, Dec. 28.—**—Today of harvesting in Argentina due to rains was a cause of strength in wheat market. The market closed firm, with May up \$4.00. May corn up 10¢, and oats were mixed up.

The wheat market opened strong and for a time prices continued to advance on a good demand from commercial houses, local grain dealers, short-holders for the winter, and others. The one most frequently mentioned at the start was the possibility of a short crop in Argentina. Some thinking of more immediate importance, however, was a report from Argentina that heavy rain was again prevailing in the wheat-growing areas, and that harvesting was being delayed. This was the reason given as a result of these advances, and the higher prices abroad were largely responsible for the gains here. The market closed 10¢ higher, at \$6.00 per bushel. May advanced steadily to 10¢, an advance of 1¢ from the low point. Industrial wheat, 10¢ lower, and 10¢ higher, closed 10¢ higher. General selling set in during the last half hour on a rumor that the big bull operator was unloading, and much of the advance was taken off. The market closed 10¢ higher, at \$6.00 per bushel.
