

GRAIN AND PRODUCE MARKET

Prospects of War Cause Sharp Advance in Price of Wheat.

MAY OPTION IS THREE CENTS HIGHER

Corn Advances in Price Nearly Two Cents, While Oats Are Somewhat Higher, as Are Also Provisions.

CHICAGO, Jan. 2.—Favorable advice from European capitals in regard to the possibility of war in the far east caused an advance of 5/8c in May wheat, 3/4c in corn and 7/8c in pork today. While all the advances did not hold, closing prices were near the top.

The news was the chief topic of conversation before the session opened and when the bell rang for the opening of business there was a rush of buying orders in the wheat pit. No sellers were to be found, however. As a result initial sales reached 70,000 bushels, against 40,000 in the previous session.

The price began to rise on Thursday's advance of 5/8c and there was considerable speculation and the price settled higher at 5 3/8c. The demand continued good at all times, however, and the market rallied on all small recessions. The feature of trading was a lack of offerings, a scarcity of the morning for the victims of the speculators.

The market started slow, but was soon influenced by the strength in wheat and corn, and closed at a higher level. There was good buying by some of the speculators and the offerings came largely from commission houses.

Provisions were higher at 3 1/2c for pork, 3 1/2c for lard, and 3 1/2c for tallow. The leading futures ranged as follows:
