Declines in Foreign Markets and Favorable Weather in the South-east Partly Responsible for the Slump.

CHICAGO, Jan. 22.—Bears vanquished the bulls in the wheat pit today, forcing prices to a lower level. Declines in foreign grain markets and favorable weather in the south-west with the prospect of a heavy crop in the east, closing prices were broken to the bottom with May 1904 lower, corn 1/2 cent, and wheat 1/2 cent. Provisions closed 2/10 cent higher.
