IOWA CITY, Ia., Feb. 3.-(Special.)-Manager H. E. Spangler of lows announces four of his foot ball dates for next fail. They are: Beptember 24, Augustana college of Rock Island, at lows field. October 3, Drake university, at Des Moines or lows field. October 15, Chicago, at Chicago. November 19, Illinois, at Champaign. 




