

GRAIN AND PRODUCE MARKET

Bull Movement in Wheat Still Goes Merely Onward. Price Still Soars, With No Bears. Corn Reacts a Little, But Takes a Brace, While Oats Break Under Neglect, Finally Recovering.

OMAHA, Feb. 20, 1904. May wheat in Chicago reached \$1.05. The Omaha exchange crowd was excitedly waiting for the quotation on Friday. Joining in the bull movement, a considerable number of speculators watched the performance from the grain floor. The high market was due to the war conditions and the reported short supply of wheat. The milling trade, for all it is worth, everything opened strong, and the highest point was reached shortly before the close, when a strong rally was made.

Chicago's advance of 3/4c in May wheat Omaha only gained 1/4c. Chicago advanced 1/2c on Friday, and this was the low figure for the day. It advanced to \$1.04, wakened to \$1.03, then soared to \$1.06, crooked to \$1.05 and at the closing minute gained a quarter cent. The Chicago report of foreign buyers and long taking profits, satisfied buyers and afraid to hold over Sunday and Monday.

July wheat, while not the sensation of the day, opened at \$1.00, and closed an eighth over the close and advanced 1/4c, closing at 85 1/2c. This future was in demand in the morning, but the opening bid to 85c, but the long seemed satisfied with their holdings.

NEW YORK STOCKS AND BONDS

Market Overcomes Depressing Influences and Grows Bull. Prices Are Held Above the London Level-Paris Usenet Has Slight Effect-Bond Market Dull.

NEW YORK, Feb. 20.-The character of the stock market showed no change today from that of the whole week. The effects of the day's depressing influences were moderate and were well resisted. But once the depression was overcome all interest in the market was revived. The market seemed to be a waiting demand for stocks on any decline, but no buyers were at hand to follow any advance. The principal pressure upon the market came from foreign sources. This was well absorbed and prices were at no time depressed. The sentiment of the day was decided upon in the Paris and Berlin bourses was very bullish. The severe decline on the Paris bourse are attributed to financial causes caused by the shrinkage in Russian securities which are a poor sale at the present time, so that necessities must be met by sale of other securities. The weakness of state funds at Paris, which, however, due to intimate knowledge of diplomatic information not available to other centers, which would explain its greater effect on that market.

The \$1,500,000 increase in cash in the bank statement was not unexpected and is attributed to a return of money from the south, where the cotton crop has advanced. Some of the money sent to Baltimore is believed to have come from London, as evidence that corporation borrowings have been largely supplied out of the market. The London market also has the proceeds of railroad loans are left on deposit with the banks pending the need for similar loans which are available to the loan market in the mean time. The market closed about steady and not far from the opening level.

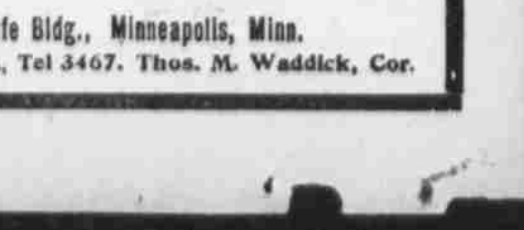
