Legal Tangle to Decide Ownership is to Come Up in the District Court. A legal tangle over the possession and ownership of a sealskin coat and muff will be tackled by the machinery of the district court next week.

A year or more ago Dr. H. G. Welse, widower of the Withnell block, bought for his wife, Mary V. Welse, a sealskin coat and muff, for which he agreed to pay the sum of \$300. A comparatively small sum of money was paid down and several notes given by Dr. Welse to Gus E. Shukert, of whom he made the purchase.

According to Mr. Shukert's story, the money did not come in as agreed, and accordingly a year later he got possession of the coat by a letter from Dr. J. Platt, attorney for Dr. Welse's claim, is irregular, namely, by representing in the writ by means of which he obtained possession of it that he held a chattel mortgage on the garments.
