It is now said W. H. Bancroft, general manager of the Union Pacific, has changed his plan of making Omaha his home. Mr. Bancroft has just completed a new and very fine residence in Salt Lake City and will occupy it, so railroad gossip has it. This action on the part of the general manager raises the question as to how much of his time he will spend in Omaha. It is believed by those who are supposed to know, that J. M. Gruber will administer the affairs of the Union Pacific and that his authority will be complete except in most important matters, and in these, of course, he will be obliged to consult with the general manager. It is not thought Mr. Bancroft will spend much of his time in Omaha after Mr. Gruber becomes thoroughly familiar with the affairs of the company. In order to familiarize himself with the details of the line Mr. Gruber is spending most of his time in consulting with the general manager. He, together with E. Buckingham, superintendent of transportation, is looking over the terminal properties of the company in Omaha.

HOAGLAND OUT OF OLD HOME

Moves from Down Town Residence and Graders Will Soon Begin Their Work.

George A. Hoagland has just finished moving from his home on Sixteenth street to the MacKenzie house on Thirty-eighth avenue. Work has been begun in cutting down trees on the Sixteenth street property and a contract for grading down the lots was let Friday afternoon by the movers, Hollenbeck Bros. company. The house cannot be moved until the ground under it is cut down. The house is to be divided and moved to Thirty-eighth street, Dundee, between California and Cass streets. The Hoaglands will occupy it when it is relocated.

FEW ST. PATRICKS IN COURT

Seventeen Arrests in All, Some Victims Appearing with Shamrock Mementoes.

The police station records show that on St. Patrick's day seventeen arrests were made, six being of the plain drunk variety, several being drunk and hostile and the remainder miscellaneous.

John Collins, with a shamrock pinned to his coat lapel and a shamrock-after-expression on his face, told Judge Berka, when arraigned, that he was from Pittsburg and was merely scouring here and wished to proceed, showing he had 10 cents to take him across the bridge. John assured the judge that if released and found in Omaha five minutes afterward he would

cheerfully submit to a sentence of six months. The police magistrate looked at the 10 cents and then at the shamrock, and told Collins he might go his way.

Abie Braniff, 613 South Tenth street, was fined \$5 and costs in police court for an assault said to have been committed on Himan Haspell, proprietor of a Douglas street lunch wagon. According to the evidence, Braniff and a companion were patrons at the lunch vehicle a few nights ago and a dispute arose over the payment of one frankfurter sandwich. Angry words are said to have been exchanged between the merchant and customer; the electric light sputtered and Braniff picked up a brick and passed it to Haspell, striking the lunch man on one eye and most of his teeth. Braniff then ran away, so that he might live to fight another day, Haspell declared.

NEW BUILDING PERMIT RULE

Order Issued Compelling Owners or Architect to Take Out the License.

Notice has been issued by the building department that in future architects or owners must take out permits for construction and repairs instead of leaving this duty to the contractors.

Chief Clerk Grotte estimates that thousands of dollars in fees have been lost to the city in the past because the contractors obtained the permits and charged the permit fee. He has gone to the city hall and secured permits for the amount of his contract, this being offered as the estimated cost of the structure.

Letters recently were sent out from the building department to all architects advising them of the innovation and some have replied, saying this course meets with their approval and they will endeavor to follow it out.
