Bishep Potter Endorses Mary Platt Parmele's History of Russia.

"BREAKING INTO SOCIETY," BY GEO. ADE

It is a Collection of New "Fables" in the Author's Original and Inimitable Style Which Make His Works So Popular.

"There are histories and histories," writes Bishop Henry C. Potter in a private letter to Mary Platt Parmele, author of "A Short History of Russia," "abbreviations without color or spirit, and elaborations of equal irksomeness and useless monotony. have given us, your readers, a panoramic view of the policy and life of the great em-

pire in a singularly felicitous way." He concludes: "Any one who reads your 'Short History' would have the life of the people of Russia, from the first dawn of its civilization, and long before, in a remarkably clear way before their mental vision. To have achieved such a work is a great triumph, and the book ought to find a place, especially at this critical moment, in the edcuation of all our youths."




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
