ting Out Material.

Not a pile has yet been driven or a stone laid to the end of constructing the dike at East Omaha, and the reason given is that the roads are in such condition that it is as yet impossible to haul the material to the ground. Freight bills for the hauling of stone by the Union Pacific raffroad, to the extent of nearly \$100, already have been allowed by the commissioners, and one or two others are still pending, while the stone that has been unloaded from the cars is scattered all along the route to where the work is to be done.






